The growing challenges of space debris, increasingly crowded orbits, and the threat of harmful interference demand our urgent attention. We have a collective responsibility to safeguard the space environment through responsible and collaborative practices. The decisions we make today will shape not only the future of satellite communications but also the future of space as a shared resource for all generations to come.
